Contest Rules:

- 1. Any Junior or Senior attending a Kansas tax-supported public high school is eligible.
- 2. Contact any Kansas Masonic Lodge, Kansas Mason, or your counselor for information.
- 3. Essays will be judged on originality and development of the topic.
- 4. Contestant **must follow contest** rules as to topic, number of words, etc.
- 5. Essays shall be limited to a minimum of 300 and a maximum of 500 words.
- 6. Essays must be typewritten, double spaced, with work cited, on standard 81/2" x 11" paper with a 12 point Arial font.
- 7. The **original and one copy** of the essay must be submitted to the Local Lodge.
- 8. Essays MUST have a title page (download from KMF web site) that will show the student's name, gender, complete address, Junior or Senior Class, and School name. This information shall appear only on the title page. All pages, except the title page, must be numbered.

NO REFERENCE TO THE ESSAY, STUDENT'S NAME, TOWN OR SCHOOL SHOULD APPEAR ANYWHERE IN THE BODY OF THE ESSAY.

- 9. All essays become the property of the Local Masonic Lodge and may be published without the author's permission.
- 10. Essays must be submitted to the Local Lodge on or before **November 1, 2015.**
- 11. The winning essay(s) from a Local Lodge (one per high school in the Lodge's area) will be sent to the Grand Lodge and must be postmarked no later than December 1, 2015.
- 12. There are no contest entry forms. Essays are to be presented to the Local Lodge.
- 13. Essays must first win the Local Lodge competition before they can be submitted for State competition.
- 14. Grand Lodge essay winners will be notified prior to March 1, 2016.

2016 Horatio Alger Scholarship Application Information

The Horatio Alger Association seeks to assist students who have demonstrated integrity, perseverance in overcoming adversity, strength of character, financial need, a good academic record, commitment to pursue a college education, and a desire to contribute to society.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be considered eligible for Horatio Alger National and State Scholarship Programs, applicants must:

- Be enrolled full-time as a high school senior in the United States, progressing normally toward graduation in spring/summer of 2016 with plans to enter a college in the United States no later than the fall following graduation
- Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution)
- Demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or lower adjusted gross family income is required)
- Be involved in co-curricular and community service activities
- Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity
- Maintain a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0
- Be a United States citizen

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

To apply for the Horatio Alger Scholarship Programs, the following items must be completed by October 25, 2015:

- An online application at scholars.horatioalger.org
- ♦ One Support Form completed online. This must be completed by an adult over the age of 21 who is not related to the applicant and who is aware of the adversities mentioned in the application. This form must be filled out online. Faxes, emails, or letters will not be accepted.
- Online Certification Form. A login will be emailed to the applicant's counselor.
- ♦ High school transcript. Applicants should upload a transcript through the application. **Transcripts must be submitted** online.
- Income Verification. A copy of the first page of the applicant's parent(s) federal tax return (1040, 1040A, 1040 EZ or 1099 SSA-Social Security form) or tax transcript (request a tax transcript here www.irs.gov/Individuals/Order-a-Transcript) for 2014 is needed in order to verify income stated on the application. If an applicant's parents were not required to file a tax return, include statement copies of any government benefits, such as Public Assistance or Disability payment documents. Income verifications may be uploaded online or sent by mail. Applicants of divorced or legally separated parents need to submit tax forms from both parents. No emails or faxes accepted.

REVIEW all applications online, and then select one Local Honoree and up to two runners-up for every 1,000 students (or portion thereof).

CERTIFY your designated Local Honoree(s) and nominate him/her/them on behalf of the principal for state-level judging by 11:59 p.m. Central Standard Time on **Tuesday**, **November 10**.

RECOGNIZE your Local Honoree(s) and runners-up, and present them with the enclosed certificates. (For additional certificates, call 877-525-8491).
