- **Locations:** ONLINE/ONGROUND (HYBRID)

- **Limit:** 10 students per clinical site —enrollment is on a first-come, first-serve basis with pre-enrollment requirements completed

- Scrubs are required to be worn at clinicals — cost varies depending on where purchased
- Pre-enrollment Tests: Two-step TB skin test **and** Accuplacer English min score 54 or Compass reading min score 60 or ACT reading min score 13
- **Required Equipment/Software:** Must have access to a computer with reliable internet access. A Smart Phone or iPad (tablet) does not meet all requirements. Course can be viewed with any Web browser; Internet Explorer, Firefox, Google Chrome, and Safari are some examples. Students using IE 11 will need to be in compatibility mode for some functions to work properly. Internet Explorer 10 does not need to be in compatibility mode. Problems in typing into text boxes (such as discussion forums) are often solved by switching to compatibility mode. Dial up access is not recommended for LCC online courses.
