#### **School Closure**

Per the Executive Order (20-07) issued by Governor Kelly on March 17th, 2020 all school buildings are closed until at least **May 29th, 2020**. This will impact USD 247 in the following ways:

- 1.) All school-sponsored activities/athletics are cancelled for the remainder of the Spring
- 2.) All school-sponsored trips, club meetings, dances, etc. are cancelled for the remainder of the Spring semester.
- 3.) Middle school promotion and high school graduation as originally scheduled is currently postponed. <u>Our district and building administration are working to decide upon how we can still honor our graduates in some way and those plans are TBD at this time.</u>
- 4.) PreK Jump Start summer program and KRR summer camp will be determined at a later date.
- 5.) PreK and Kindergarten Round Up will be determined at a later date.
