SPANISH 1

• **Course Description:** Spanish 1 introduces students to the four basic language skills: listening comprehension, speaking, reading, and writing, within a cultural context. ACFTL Proficiency Guidelines Novice Low indicators for first semester and Novice Mid for second semester.

Standards:

- 1. Students will communicate in languages other than English.
- **1.1 Interpersonal:** Students can greet, introduce themselves, ask and answer simple questions, and have short conversations about daily life.
- **1.2 Interpretive:** Students can understand basic spoken and written texts, like short stories, signs, or simple dialogues.
- **1.3 Presentational:** Students can write or speak short paragraphs about themselves, their routines, and interests.
- 2. Students will gain knowledge and understanding of other cultures.
- 2.1 Students can notice and explain how daily life, holidays, food, and traditions reflect what people value and believe.
- 3. Students will connect with other disciplines and acquire information.
- 3.1 Students can learn about other subjects like geography, history, or science using Spanish.

- 4. Students will develop insight into the nature of language and culture.
