

## Q1 Which of the following best describes you (select all that apply):


## Q2 What is your age range?







In contrast, the main building does not adequately support ADA and accessibility needs, which is an important factor when considering long-term costs and equity. My family has deep roots in the Weir; my father attended Weir, I am a graduate of Weir Jr. High, and my children attended PreK through 4th grade there. While I want to preserve as much of the history of Weir as possible, realistically, spending \$750,000 to repair the main building is not feasible.
